What is Medical Assisting?

Medical assistants complete administrative and clinical tasks in the offices of physicians, hospitals and other healthcare facilities. Their duties vary with the location, specialty and size of the practice.



MEDICAL ASSISTANTS

- Handle patient intake and care
- Perform routine diagnostic and recording procedures
- Administer EKG tests
- Conduct pre-examination and examination assistance
- Administer medications and first aid

INDUSTRY CERTIFICATIONS

Medical Assisting

- **Registered Medical Assistant (RMA)** from American Medical Technologists (AMT) (after completion of optional externship)
- **National Certified Medical Assistant (NCMA)** through the National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT)

Phlebotomy

- **National Certified Phlebotomy Technician (NCPT)** through the National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT)
- **Registered Phlebotomy Technician (RPT)** from American Medical Technologists (AMT) (requires additional draws)

EKG

- **National Certified ECG Technician (NCET)** through the National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT)

There is no mandatory requirement that medical assistants hold a license in the states of Illinois, Wisconsin or Indiana to practice. However, professional certification is generally required to qualify for employment in most clinical settings.
