



## Voter Registration



The Higher Education Act Amendments of 1998 require colleges to make a good faith effort to make voter registration forms available to students.

### Illinois Voter Registration Information:

The pamphlet, Registering to Vote in Illinois, describes the rules and procedures surrounding the voter registration process in Illinois. An individual may register to vote in Illinois if he/she is 18 years or older on the next Election Day, resides in the jurisdiction for 30 days prior to the election, and is a U.S. citizen.

Illinois residents may register online, in person at the office of the election authority, at Driver's license facilities, with deputy registrars who are appointed in each jurisdiction, or via mail using the Illinois Voter Registration Application available in English and Spanish.

Registration is closed during the 27 days prior to an election. Individuals who miss the deadline may register or transfer their registration at the office of the election authority under the guidelines of grace period registration.

## **Voting Eligibility:**

**You can vote** in U.S. elections if you:

- Are a U.S. citizen;
- Meet your state's residency requirements;
  - You can be homeless and still meet these requirements.
- Are 18 years old on or before Election Day;
  - In almost every state, you can register to vote before you turn 18 if you will be 18 by Election Day.
- Are registered to vote by your state's voter registration deadline.
  - North Dakota does not require voter registration.

**You cannot vote** in U.S. elections if you:

- Are a non-citizen, including permanent legal residents and F-1 students;
- have some with felony convictions. Rules vary by state. Check with your state elections office about the laws in your state.
- Some people who are mentally incapacitated. Rules vary by state.
- For President in the general election: U.S. citizens residing in U.S. territories
- Check with your state or local election office for any questions about who can and can't vote.
